Your kindness is needed now more than ever.

Each year, thousands of homeless people in the UK spend Christmas on the streets, cold, hungry and lonely without a family to go to. For millions of people nationwide, winter marks the end of another year struggling through the ongoing housing emergency. Rents continue to soar. Too few homes are being built. More people than ever, including families and children, are stuck in unsafe or temporary accommodation, forced to make choices that leave them in poverty. Instead of looking forward to hot meals, warmth and time with loved ones, many people face insecurity.

Social Bite needs your help to create a movement of kindness to spread festive goodwill to people who are homeless and vulnerable this Christmas.

Since 2020, over **1.4 million** Christmas meals, food packs, gifts, and essential items have been distributed through Festival of Kindness to people affected by homelessness and food poverty.



Festival of Kindness

We are on a mission to provide 300,000 meals, gifts, and essential items to people who are homeless and vulnerable this winter. As well as this, with your help, we are helping to provide accommodation to people sleeping rough and energy support during this cost-of-living crisis. In whatever way you can, we are inviting you to join us to share some much-needed kindness this Christmas.

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Christmas Kindness *in action*

By taking part in the Festival of Kindness, this is what you will be making possible:



Christmas Dinners and Food Provision

On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, Social Bite will be opening up our coffee shops and other venues to provide a warm Christmas dinner and some loving company for those who need it. Our staff always give up their Christmas day every year to ensure that homeless and vulnerable people have some delicious food to eat and some festive company. This year we will also be distributing food packs and hot meals to tens of thousands of people in food poverty through a network of charity partners all over the UK.



Gifts and Essential Items

We will be working with a network of charities and community groups to distribute tens of thousands of Christmas gifts and essential items. These will range from children's toys for families in poverty to warm clothes for homeless people to mobile phones and lap-tops to get people connected. In the following pages you will see a detailed "Gift Wishlist" that you can donate financially towards, or buy the gift yourself and place it under the Christmas trees we are installing in city centres. Our team will then organise distribution all over the country in time for Christmas.



Emergency Shelter and Support

This winter we are teaming up with charity partners in all five cities to help fund emergency shelter and support for people sleeping rough. In partnership with local and national government we are supporting an effort to provide accommodation so that people sleeping rough can have warm shelter over the winter period in a hotel room where social distancing can be maintained. Your donations will help us fund dedicated support to help them find their feet and secure follow on accommodation.

Donations will also be used to develop longer term programs providing homes, jobs, and food to break the cycle of homelessness throughout the year

Bring a gift to the Tree of Kindness



You can donate a present to someone who is homeless or vulnerable and place it under the tree along with a personal message of kindness.

Donated items will be placed in weather-proof perspex boxes and collected each evening for transportation to a secure location nearby. We will work with our network of local charity partners to distribute the gifts to homeless people, families, and children in poverty in the community.

- Children's Toys
- Family Board Games
- Arts & Crafts Sets
- Beauty & Grooming Products
- Toiletry Gift Sets
- Hot Water Bottles
- Thermos Flasks
- Sleeping Bags
- Blankets
- Torches
- Power Banks
- Mobile Phone Top ups & Sim Cards
- Earphones
- Supermarket Vouchers

Don't

- ✗ Give alcohol
 - ✗ Provide home-baking
 - ✗ Drop off the goods outside of advertised opening times for the trees
 - ✗ Give second hand goods
 - ✗ Bring wrapped gifts.
- For safety reasons and to help us ensure the gift gets to the right person, we ask that the gifts you donate should not be wrapped. We will make sure they are wrapped ahead of being gifted to the recipient though.

Here's how your business can get involved:



Corporate donations

Corporate donations have a significant impact on the number of people we can support with Christmas and winter meals, gifts and essentials. This could come from an end-of-year charity pot, or donating part of a Christmas party budget. £1,000 could fund 200 Christmas dinners and £10,000 could secure vital accommodation for those in need throughout the winter months. For donations of £5,000 and above, your generous gift will receive special recognition at our Trees of Kindness on branded gift boxes, on our website and social media.

Social Bite's Big Christmas Quiz



Fingers on buzzers!

Bring colleagues together from across your organisation to take part in a fun Christmas quiz in aid of Social Bite and our mission to end homelessness.

A great way to add in something extra fun team-building into your Christmas party or bring together both office based and remote working colleagues for a fun activity.

What do I need to do?

Hold a 'Festive Big Social Bite'



Get Together, Share Food,
Pay it Forward this
Christmas!

Get together with colleagues this winter to share some great food with an important difference.

Whether it's a Christmas Party, a festive bake sale, or sharing a lovely team lunch to celebrate the end of the year, a Festive Big Social Bite gives you an opportunity to ask guests to 'Pay it Forward' by making a donation to Social Bite.

This is a great way to bring together colleagues from across the business to share some time and food together at Christmas and support Social Bite.

What do I need to do?

1. Plan your Festive Big Social Bite. Pick a day and venue for your team to get together and share some delicious food, this could be booking a location or asking colleagues to bring their favourite festive treats into the office on a day
2. Set up your [JustGiving page](#) to start collecting donations. You can ask each guest to make a donation, as well as sharing across colleagues who may be unable to attend but wish to make a donation to ensure someone who is experiencing homelessness can have a Christmas Dinner

5km a day, for 24 days

Lace up the running shoes and take on the ultimate Advent Challenge by running 5km every day from the 1st December until the 24th December to raise funds for the mission to end homelessness.



Whether it's colleagues taking on the challenge solo, or rallying colleagues into a running club together, this is a great chance to engage team members looking for motivation to keep hitting their running goals or build some team spirit of the festive period.

Add in a fun Christmassy twist to runs throughout the challenge by asking runners to don a Santa hat, reindeer antlers, or a Christmas Jumper for a run.

Completely free to enter. It only takes seconds to register as an individual or create a team entry to fundraise collectively.

What do I need to do?

1. Invite colleagues to sign up for free. Register your interest [here](#).
2. Your fundraising page will be automatically created so you can start collecting sponsorship, connect your fitness app to track your runs, and add your photos.
3. Start clocking up your 5km!

Fundraising ideas for colleague engagement



Buy someone homeless a Christmas dinner

Invite colleagues across the organisation to donate £5 to buy a Christmas dinner for someone experiencing homelessness. We can help you set up a JustGiving page so you can see how many meals you've collectively made possible.



Christmas Jumper Day

Get in the festive spirit by wearing a Christmas Jumper for a day – Simply pick a day that staff must show up, online or in the office, in their festive jumpers!

Top Tip

Ask for a donation of £2 for each person to take part



Secret Santa

We know many of you run a Secret Santa at this time of year. Perhaps this year, encourage staff to make a donation on behalf of their colleague. Share with them that their gift has helped to provide someone in a situation of homelessness with a Christmas meal this year.



Christmas Baking

Whether you're back in the office or still working from home, get your Christmas bake on! It could be a live taste test or an online best decorated bake competition. £2 entry fee and a prize for the best festive bake.

Fundraising ideas for colleague engagement

Christmas Party Budgets



There are lots of ways your Christmas party can help support:

- Donate a % of your Christmas party budget to the Festival of Kindness, helping those most in need this winter.
- Perhaps you could pledge that for every employee attending your organisation's Christmas party, a £5 donation is made to the Festival of Kindness – helping vulnerable people and families to enjoy a Christmas meal this year.
- Alternatively, encourage each employee to make a donation of £5 (or a donation of their choice) on the evening, helping to buy someone homeless a Christmas meal.
- Communicate to your team how this money will be spent and how much of a difference this will make to thousands of people across the UK.
